We are:

The European External Action Service (EEAS) supports the High Representative in the exercise of his mandate to conduct and implement an effective and coherent EU Common Foreign and Security Policy (CFSP), of representing the EU and of chairing the Foreign Affairs Council. It also supports the High Representative in his capacity as Vice-President of the Commission with regard to his responsibilities within the Commission in the external relations field including the coordination of other aspects of the EU's external action. The EEAS works in close cooperation with the General Secretariat of the Council, the services of the Commission and the Secretariat General of the European Parliament.

We propose:

The position of Seconded National Expert (SNE) covering Security/Counterterrorism issues in **Jordan** at the **EU Delegation to Amman (Jordan)**, as a "co-financed" secondment, i.e. salary, insurances, accommodation and other costs are to be paid by the EU MS as appropriate and specific allowances to be paid by the EEAS.

Overall purpose: to monitor counter-terrorism, related security developments in Jordan and Syria, help establish and maintain EU relations with local counterparts on counterterrorism and preventing/countering violent extremism (P/CVE) and transnational or organised crime relating to terrorism in Jordan; to contribute to analysis and reporting in the fields of security, counterterrorism, rule of Law, security sector reform, within the aim to further strengthening EU-Jordan security and defence cooperation under the envisaged Comprehensive and Strategic Partnership (SCP), under the direct supervision of the Head of Delegation. Due attention to human rights and the rule of law which are central the EU's approach to countering terrorism, should be given. He/she will be based in Amman, and may be required to travel in the country and in the region as necessary.

We are looking for:

The European External Action Service (EEAS) is seeking a highly motivated colleague (SNE) to occupy the post of Seconded National Expert (SNE) at the **EU Delegation to Jordan**.

The expert will assist / contribute:

• To follow the terrorism landscape and related security developments in **Jordan** and Syria, and support EEAS Headquarters, as well as the EU Delegation (and other Delegations as appropriate in the region) with advice on matters related to security, with a focus on counterterrorism, radicalisation, and preventing/countering violent extremism, border security and transnational and organised crime as these relate to countering terrorism;

• To provide regular and timely reporting to the Security and Defence Policy Directorate (CT Division) at EEAS Headquarter, via the EU Delegation on the above mentioned topics including monthly reports, early warnings, specific requests, info flashes, "think pieces", as well as responses to specific requests.;

• To ensure close coordination with Member States' security advisers, police liaison officers and counterterrorism officers, including by participating in and/or convening relevant coordination meetings on matters pertaining to Jordan;

• To develop and maintain a network made of the relevant Law enforcement institutions and Interior Ministry and General Intelligence Department in Jordan, as well as UN, local and international civil society, etc.;

• To closely cooperate with the Commission services (including MEDI, FPI, HOME, FISMA, etc.) in the identification, formulation and implementation of programmes and activities relating to counterterrorism, P/CVE and transnational crime activities in Jordan and Syria, in line with the Security and Defence Policy Directorate (CT Division) strategic advice.

Legal Basis:

This vacancy is to be filled in accordance with EEAS Decision of the High Representative of the Union for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy Decision HR DEC (2014)01 of 04/02/2014 establishing the rules applicable to National Experts seconded to the European External Action Service.

Eligibility criteria:

Candidates must:

a) Be drawn from public administrations in Member States, from international organisations or, only in exceptional cases and with prior authorisation from other sources;

b) Have at least five years' full-time experience of diplomatic, advisory or supervisory functions equivalent to those of function groups AD as defined in the Staff Regulations of Officials of the European Union and the Conditions of Employment of other servants of the Union¹ or, where justified in the interests of the service, professional training of an equivalent level;

c) Have a thorough knowledge of English and a satisfactory knowledge of a second language for the performance of his/her duties; knowledge of Arabic would be a strong asset;

d) Have a security clearance of minimum level EU-SECRET for the functions that he/she will carry out;

e) Remain in the service of the employer throughout the period of secondment and shall be paid by that employer;

f) Remain subject to the social security legislation applicable to the public administration, international administration or entity which employs the SNE and which will assume responsibility for expenses incurred abroad. In case of posting to an EU Delegation, the employer certifies that the SNE is covered for medical expenses incurred at the place of secondment, as well as costs of repatriation on health grounds throughout the full period of secondment;

g) Ensure that there is no conflict of interest and that they will, at all times, safeguard the independence and coherence of EU foreign policy as well as the integrity and confidentiality of EU documentation, information and procedures.

Selection criteria:

Candidates should:

A. Professional knowledge

• Have a professional experience of at least 5 years, preferably in the Ministry of Interior/Police, Foreign Affairs, Police or Justice Area, and specific experience in Counterterrorism/transnational crime/ Prevention/ Deradicalisation/ or related issues; experience in conflict/post-conflict situations would be an asset.

• Extensive knowledge of the above mentioned policy areas are required, including conflict sensitive analytical capacities, security/CT policies in Member States. Good working knowledge of the EU (institutional) environment and instruments in the area of external and cooperation policy. Proven reporting and analysis capacity.

B. Skills

• Have the capacity to work and communicate under time constraints in an international diplomatic and multilingual environment. Intercultural sensitivity skills are required.

• Be a team worker and have good coordination and communication skills

• Have solid analytical capability as well as drafting and reporting skills. Rapid grasp of problems and capacity to identify issues and solutions.

D. Languages

Thorough knowledge (capacity to write and speak) English is required. Satisfactory knowledge of a second language for the performance of his/her duties and local language(s) would be a strong asset.

E. Personal Qualities

Dynamic. Motivated and flexible personality. Able to adapt quickly to new situations and deal with new challenges, including missions in conflict areas

F. Equal opportunities

• The EEAS is committed to an equal opportunities policy for all its employees and applicants for employment. As an employer, the EEAS is committed to promoting gender equality and to preventing discrimination on any grounds. G. Conditions of secondment

SNEs shall remain in the service of their employer throughout the period of secondment and shall continue to be paid by that employer. The EEAS will provide for the allowances in order to contribute to cover the SNE's living expenses in the place of secondment on a flat-rate basis. These allowances shall not be construed as remuneration paid by the EEAS.

Duration of the secondment: Initial period up to two years, renewable up to 4 years. Co-financed SNEs shall be entitled to a:

□ daily allowance (173.30€/ calendar day) throughout the period of secondment

□ monthly allowance calculated according to the distance between the point of origin of the employer and the place of secondment (between 0 to 977.90 €/month)

□ Living Condition Allowance: 15%

The EEAS will cover for certain security costs and missions costs incurred by the SNE posted in the EU Delegation. Other costs such as removal costs, salary, insurance, accommodation, schooling, etc. shall not be covered by the EEAS.
